Notes

***Lim-Flex, Maintainer, Shorthorn Plus, SimSolution and Charolais Composite**

Below is a list of requirements for each composite breed in this group:

- Lim-Flex – any animal holding purple Lim-Flex papers are eligible to show in this division.
- Maintainer – any animal that shows ¼ to 5/8 on their papers are eligible to show in this division.
- Shorthorn Plus – any animal that shows 3/8 to 7/8 on their papers are eligible to show in this show
- SimSolution – any animal showing 50% to 75% on their papers are eligible to show in this division.
- Charolais Composite – any animal holding Yellow papers should be at least 50% Charolais and eligible to show in this division.

These guidelines came directly from the above breed associations. We believe that the State Fair will follow these guidelines also.

This is a little different than last year. Our goal is to stay consistent with the State Fair if possible so that an animal doesn't show all spring in one AJCA division and then get to State Fair and get put in another division.

****AOB—All Other Breeds**—This division is intended for any purebred or fullblood breed that is not listed above. In order to qualify for this division, an animal must be registered as a high percentage (75% or higher based on breed) animal within the respective breed association. Any registered high percentage animal that fits this description and is not in an AJCA recognized breed/division should be classified as AOB. Example: Belted Galloway, Braunvieh, etc.

*****AOB Composite**—This division is intended for any registered composite animal that is not in an AJCA recognized breed. In order to qualify for this division, an animal must be registered as a composite animal within the respective breed association. Any registered animal that fits this description and is not in an AJCA recognized breed/division should be classified as AOB Composite. *Because this division is so new, AJCA may not be aware of all low percentage breeds.* Examples of this division include (but are not limited to): Star 5 (Santa Gertrudis), Optimizers (Salers), Balancers (Gelbvieh), Angus Plus (Red Angus), UltraBlack (Brangus), F1 (Brahman), E6 (Beefmaster).
